Master's in Arabic Language

Program Overview

In February 1981, a graduate program was opened in the Department of Arabic Language and Literature for a master's degree in the Arabic language in two specializations: "Literature and Criticism" and "Language and Grammar." Hundreds of master's theses have been discussed in the department so far, the first of which was in February 1983.

Program Objectives

- (1) Providing and preparing opportunities for outstanding and talented students from the Arabic Language Department and some other departments and specializations to complete their graduate studies in the various specialization branches of this program locally, regionally, and globally.
- (2) Transferring the student from the stage of pure reception to another mental stage characterized by consideration and doubt leading to certainty or semi-certainty.
- (3) Training the student not to be satisfied with a small amount of information, but to delve into sources and references to complete the circle of research and exploration.
- (4) Training the student to analyze information derived from sources and references, infer what he deems appropriate from them, and come up with possible conclusions.
- (5) Providing academic research bodies and specialized bodies with cadres capable of research, analysis, inference and conclusion.

Program Importance

This program could not be approved until the necessary qualified and experienced staff was available. So that the outputs have value and impact in the academic and research field.

Targeted Groups and Accepted Majors

- (1) Distinguished graduates of Arabic language departments who hold a bachelor's degree,
- (2) Graduates of colleges of arts departments who hold a bachelor's degree,
- (3) University graduates with a master's degree or higher in disciplines other than colleges of arts who have an inclination and love for the Arabic language.
- (4) University graduates who hold a bachelor's degree in a field other than the Arabic language or the College of Arts specializations who have known writers and poets, or have knowledge in linguistics or literary criticism.

Job Areas

Graduates of this program can work in the following fields:

- (1) Teaching at the secondary level
- (2) Teaching general courses offered by the Arabic Language Department at the university level.
- (3) Linguistic review
- (4) Literary and linguistic criticism at the level of journalistic writing.

Credit Hours and Tuition Fees

The number of program hours is (33) credit hours. The Jordanian student pays a fee of (70) Jordanian dinars per credit hour, while the non-Jordanian student pays an amount of (225) US dollars.
