Students can obtain their degree upon completion of 24 credithours and the submission of a thesis, or 33 credit hours and passing a comprehensive examination.

Study Plan Overview

For the Comprehensive Exam Track, students need to take 33 Credit Hours: 24 Credit Hours as Compulsory and 9 Credit Hours as Elective along with a Comprehensive Exam.
For the Thesis Track, students need to take 24 Credit Hours: 15 Credit Hours as Compulsory and 9 Credit Hours as Elective along with a writing a thesis.
