

# Master's in Language Sciences (French)

### **Program Overview**

The Master's in Language Sciences (French) offers two tracks: the thesis track and the comprehensive track. The thesis track includes 33 credit hours, with 9 hours dedicated to the thesis and the remaining hours divided between 15 hours of mandatory courses and 9 hours of elective courses. The comprehensive track also includes 33 credit hours, with 24 hours of mandatory courses and 9 hours of elective courses, in addition to passing a comprehensive exam according to the university's master's degree regulations.

#### **Program Objectives**

• Teach students how to collect data and design and analyze methodologies that are particularly useful for scientific research in the field of education and enhance the fundamentals of scientific research to ensure student success in literary studies.

• Learn contemporary grammatical theories.

• Develop students' various linguistic skills in the field of linguistics and translation, while familiarizing them with the connection between linguistics and translation.

• Introduce students to various discourse analysis theories and develop their skills in the field of discourse analysis.

 Focus on the relationship between language description, typological variation, and linguistic theory by exploring a range of linguistic phenomena from traditional grammar units and explaining the documented differences between languages, which are neither arbitrary nor fixed.

#### **Program Importance**

The program prepares specialists in the French language both academically and scientifically, refining their skills and abilities, and equipping them to apply knowledge and experience in research fields and the job market. It integrates heritage understanding with openness to scientific methodologies and schools of thought, fostering critical thinking, self-learning, teamwork, and creativity.

#### **Targeted Groups and Accepted Majors**

All students who have completed the requirements for a bachelor's degree in French language and literature, or students with a bachelor's degree in the dual program of French-English language, can be considered for admission. Additionally, candidates with equivalent degrees in related fields may be considered for admission with the approval of the department council.
