Study Plan Overview

Program Requirements:

- Meet the conditions stipulated in the instructions of the master's program.
- Studying the remedial courses decided by the Graduate Studies Committee in the department.
- Consists of two tracks, the thesis track and the comprehensive track
- Studying at least (24) credit hours from the (600) level and passing them with a cumulative average of not less than 75%.
- Compulsory Major Requirements: 15 credit hours. Elective Major Requirements: 9 credit hours.
- Preparing the master's thesis and passing the examination of its discussion (9 credit hours). Or apply for the comprehensive exam for the comprehensive track and the passing mark (70) (9 credit hours).
