Program Overview

The Master's of Mathematics program was initiated in the academic year 1981/1982. The program meets the local and regional needs of scholars inmathematics for secondary education, general education and otherscientific and applied fields.

Program Objectives

- Contribute to meet the local and regional needs of scholars' in mathematics forsecondary education, general education and other scientific and applied fields.
- Expanding students' knowledge of the methods of scientific research. Enabling academically distinguished students to complete them studies forhigher degrees.
- Encouraging scientific research and publishing in prestigious scientific journals.
- Interacting with the local society by providing scientific and applied services and consultations to different sectors of society.

Targeted Groups and Accepted Majors

Students who hold a bachelor's degree in mathematics from a university recognized by higher education institutions in the Kingdom.

- Teaching in secondary schools.
- Working in financial and banking institutions.

Credit Hours and Tuition Fees

The program consists of 33 credit hours, with tuition fees of 80 Jordanian Dinars per credit hour for Jordanians, and 300 USD per credit hour for non-Jordanians.

Study Plan Overview

Master's Degree in Mathematics is awarded on the completion of the following requirements:

- 1) Meeting the conditions stipulated in the Master program bylaws.
- 2) Completion of deficiency courses recommended by the department graduate studies committee.
- 3) Studying and successfully passing at least (33) credit hours from the level of (600) and passing them with a cumulative average of no less than 75%.
