Master's in Foundations of Islamic Religion

Program Overview

The Master's Program in the Foundations of Islamic Religion was established at Yarmouk University in 2001. The program seeks to provide an attractive educational environment and prepare qualified human cadres compatible with the needs of the labor market in the fields of faith, interpretation and modern, to play its active role in serving society, according to the values of authenticity and contemporary.

Program Objectives

- * Knowledge of strategies for editing concepts and scientific terminology related to the sciences of interpretation, speech and doctrine.
- * Analyze texts, texts, and explanations in their contexts.
- * Criticizing the suspicions raised about the Holy Quran and the Holy Sunnah and their sciences.
- * Studying Islamic teams in terms of their origins, origins and intellectual and behavioral effects.
- * Graduation of scientific competencies specialized in doctrine, interpretation and modernity.

Program Importance

A pioneering program in the graduation of scientific competencies specialized in doctrine, interpretation and modern in accordance with the values of originality, contemporary and moderation, and this combination of the three disciplines gives the student a comprehensive culture, and enables him to enroll that corresponds to his scientific desires in the doctoral program.

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Targeted Groups and Accepted Majors

The program is aimed at graduates of a bachelor's degree in the faculties of Sharia and Islamic studies. Asala accepts a bachelor's degree holder in the Origins of Religion. It accepts the conditions of the campaign of other legitimate disciplines.

Job Areas

The graduate can work asala in university teaching, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Awqaf, Islamic Affairs and Sanctities, and according to the civil and military fatwa departments, the Department of the Chief Justice, the Family Reform Offices, and the Sharia Law.

Credit Hours and Tuition Fees

The student in the program studies 33 credit hours. The hourly fee is 70 dinars for the Jordanian student and \$225 for the foreign student.

Study Plan Overview

The plan consists of 33 credit hours, each representing a course of 3 hours, distributed as follows: 24 hours of compulsory theoretical, and 9 elective hours selected from a package of 27 hours, usually taught by the student between four to six semesters. It is followed by a comprehensive exam in which the student is given two opportunities, in order to achieve success, which is the condition of graduation.

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
