PhD in Tafsir (Exegesis) and Quranic Sciences

Program Overview

The Doctoral Program in Tafsir (Exegesis) and Qur'anic Sciences was established at Yarmouk University in 2001, and it is the first program of its kind in Jordanian universities. The program seeks to provide an attractive educational environment, and to prepare qualified human cadres compatible with the needs of the labor market in the fields of interpretation and Quranic sciences, to play its active role in serving society, according to the values of authenticity and contemporary.

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Program Objectives

- * Solve problems related to overlapping terms in the field of specialization.
- * Editing the places of conflict in matters of interpretation and the sciences of the Qur'an.
- * Deepening the awareness of the aesthetics of the Qur'anic text and the secrets of expression in it.
- * Criticizing the suspicions raised about the Qur'an and its sciences.
- * Providing research ideas in the field of specialization that serve the subject and enhance the knowledge of the researcher.
- * Keeping abreast of intellectual developments in the field of specialization to be tried in light of the criteria of acceptance and response in the study of the Qur'anic text.

Program Importance

A pioneering program in the graduation of scientific competencies specialized in interpretation and Quranic sciences in accordance with the values of originality, contemporary and moderation, and it is the first program in Jordanian universities to grant a doctorate degree in this specialization that does the gifts of the Holy Quran in various fields.

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Targeted Groups and Accepted Majors

The program is aimed at master's degree graduates in the faculties of Sharia and Islamic Studies. Asala accepts a master's degree in interpretation and Quran sciences, and a master's degree in the origins of religion. He accepts the conditions of the holders of other legitimate disciplines, family reform offices, and legal lawyers.

Job Areas

The graduate can work as a student in university teaching, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Awqaf, Islamic Affairs and Sanctities, and accordingly in the civil and military fatwa departments, and the Chief Justice Department.

Credit Hours and Tuition Fees

Number of study hours: The student in the program studies 54 credit hours.

Hour fees: The one-hour fee is 100 dinars for the Jordanian student and 350 dollars for the foreign student.

Study Plan Overview

The plan consists of 54 credit hours, each representing a course of study, distributed as follows: 21 compulsory theoretical hours, and 15 elective hours selected from a package of 27 hours, usually taught by the student between four to six semesters. The 18-hour doctoral thesis is usually accomplished by a student between two to four semesters.

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
